

## Do you see cases of catatonia where you can't find an underlying disorder?

**Jonathan Rogers:**

There are cases where catatonia doesn't have an underlying disorder, or at least we're not clear what the underlying disorder is. Cases I've come across have been particularly in pediatric populations, and increasingly in pediatric cases of catatonia, genetic causes are being found. And I do wonder if some of these so-called idiopathic cases of catatonia, or cases where we don't have a clear cause, have an underlying genetic disorder.
